Intellectual Property Law of 8th Semester Old Course is corresponding similar subject to Intellectual Property Law of 10th Semester New Course, Drafting Pleading and Conveyancing- II of 10th Semester Old Course is corresponding similar Subject to Drafting Pleading & Conveyancing (Practical) of 10th Semester New Course. Interpretation of absorption scheme : In case of any dispute or interpretation about the above absorption scheme from Old Course to New Course, the matter shall be referred to equivalence committee whose decision shall remain final.

Implementation of the New Course : This syllabus will be implemented from academic year 2014-15 progressively to LL.B. (3 years & 5 years) course.

Casual Admission for assessment of sessional marks of candidate absorbed in New Course : While absorption of candidates from Old Course to New Course, for the purpose of the assessment of sessional marks of the subjects other than the semesters in which he has not been regularly admitted, the candidate is required to take casual admission and college will assess and forward the sessional marks of such candidate. The marks secured by the candidates in which he gets exemption while absorption will remain unchanged.
